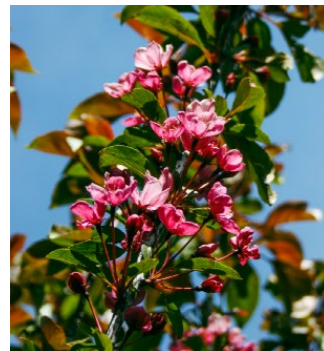


Top 10 Spring Blossom Trees



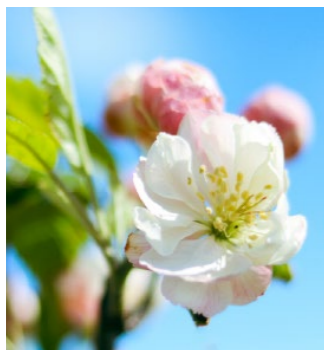
AMELANCHIER CANADENSIS
- *SHAD TREE*

Some trees give you a sign. The 'Service Berry' certainly does. When the white starry flowers arrive it usually coincides with the arrival of whitebait. The bronze tipped leaves of spring will give way to a fresh, almost mint green colour during the summer.



MALUS 'BALLERINA MAYPOLE'
- *COLUMNAR CRABAPPLE*

Narrow crabapple form. Masses of beautiful pink-red spring flowers are followed by large purple red crabapples which make delicious jelly. New growth is an attractive bronze-red. Great for tight areas. Deciduous, hardy, grows to 4m.



MALUS IOENSIS 'PLENA'
- *PRAIRIE CRABAPPLE*

Noted for its large frilly soft pink fully double flowers late spring that resemble rambling roses also have a violet-like perfume. Blossom followed by small greenish-yellow fruit. Beautiful autumn colour with bright reds, purples and gold.



PRUNUS 'ACCOLADE'
- *PINK FLOWERING CHERRY*

A graceful and small, spreading cherry tree that delicately welcomes you to spring with an abundance of semi-double flowers in the most refreshing shades of pink. As the season progresses, the colours change to an orange, then a vibrant red in Autumn.



PRUNUS SERRULATA 'KANZAN'
- *PINK FLOWERING CHERRY*

One of the most decorative cherry trees, the rich double flowers of spring are held in pendant-like clusters. Reddish-copper leaves emerge and turn to a dark green in summer, forming a dense canopy which offers shade below.

PRUNUS 'SHIMIDSU SAKURA'
- *MOONLIGHT CHERRY*

Frilly clusters of clear, rick pink double flowers arch over on drooping branches. This show brings a visual delight to springtime, while the glossy bronze-green leaves reflect the light for a lively appearance. Going from green to orange, and then scarlet in Autumn.



PRUNUS 'SHIROTAI'
- *MOUNT FUJI CHERRY*

A wonderfully formed example with a spreading horizontal habit full of semi-double snow-white flowers. Those fragrant flowers gracefully give way to the most exquisite shades of orange, gold and crimson in an Autumnal show.



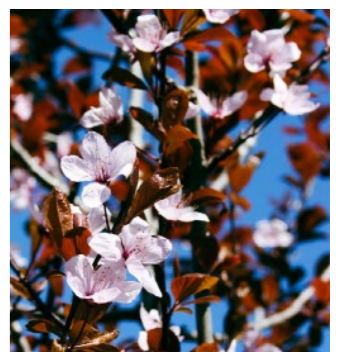
PRUNUS 'TAI HAKU'
- *GREAT WHITE CHERRY*

This is one of the largest and most spectacular versions, with fragrant, large flowers of pure white. The contrast against the coppery tones of the leaves in spring is quite remarkable and sets it apart as a specimen tree, or it is often used in avenue plantings.



PRUNUS 'THUNDERCLOUD'
- *ORNAMENTAL PLUM*

The deep purple foliage of spring is darker than nearly everything else. It adds an element of drama to a landscape. And like all good dramas it changes, with the arrival of a pale pink blossom in late spring. This small deciduous tree is suited to group plantings.



PRUNUS YEDOENSIS
- *YOSHINO CHERRY*

Known for its mass of almond scented white flowers in early spring, as the seasons progress, it changes from the warming orange of late summer to the Autumn red that typifies the season. This cherry is used extensively in street and garden plantings.
