Japanese Maples

The Japanese Maple provides a contrast to the deep and lush green leaves of summer, creating a sense of depth to the appearance that is somewhat beguiling.

They'll transfix the eyes all the way through to Autumn and Winter.

Suited to home gardens and feature planting, these Japanese Maple adds something different to most landscapes and can provide a needed human scale when surrounded by larger trees.

These trees prefer sheltered areas away from strong winds and severe frosts.

ACER palmatum 'Bloodgood' Deep Red Japanese Maple



The slender pointed palmate leaf structure creates a delicate looking aesthetic that is actually anything but. This smaller Japanese Maple's leaves reach a depth of purple few trees can achieve before moving onto a bright and vibrant red in Autumn. A smaller tree welcome in any garden, it will grow to 4m and do a good job of resisting the cold.

Suitable for Courtyards, group or specimen plantings in sheltered areas.

Features Fine deep red-purple foliage in summer.



ACER palmatum 'Osakazuki' Japanese Maple



The large 7 lobed leaves hold the key to the appeal of the Osakazuki. The bronze-green apples colour during summer has an apple-like colouring and is interesting on its own. But then, come Autumn, the leaves turn to the most striking scarlet colour of any maple. It's intense and utterly captivating. Such a show deserves a place as a feature or specimen plant. Deciduous, growing to 3 x 3m.

Suitable for Feature and specimen planting.

Features Green-bronze foliage and striking red autumn colour.



ACER palmatum dissectum 'Viridis' Green Weeping Maple



A dwarf, green maple, it has a wonderful cascading form which produces this softened aesthetic for a gentle, inviting appearance. Its Autumn show introduces shades of yellow and orange to the deeply lobed and finely serrated leaves. Deciduous, grows to 1 x 1m.

Suitable for Specimen for Parks & Gardens, Patios & Feature Plantings.

Features Cascading form and vibrant summer green foliage.



ACER palmatum 'Orangeola' Weeping Japanese Maple



The bright-orange red of spring sparkles in the sunlight. Then, as the seasons progress, a second flush of orange leaves lays over the older foliage to create a two tone effect. Those colourful leaves are also known to last longer into winter than other maples.

Suitable for Feature planting, group or specimen plantings in sheltered areas.

Features Soft green to deep purple then orange-red foliage autumn colour.



ACER palmatum dissectum 'Tamukeyama' Deep Red Weeping Maple



A wonderful weeping maple, the cascading, lacy leaves make for a soft aesthetic, introducing some gentleness to the landscape. The colour will last from spring to Autumn, when the purple-red is ignited to a fiery, dramatic red. We highly recommend placing this small, deciduous tree next to a pond. It simply works. Eventually, this maple will reach 1.5 x 1.5m.

Suitable for Feature planting

Features Fine purple foliage and cascading form.
